RED PANDA-NAMIUM RESULTS

NORFOLK, Va. – The votes are in, and the Virginia Zoo's two female red panda cubs are named Ginger and Cinnamon.

Born June 19, 2014, to mother Bernadette and father Oscar, the pair of red panda cubs are just starting to venture out of their nest box. The public can still see the cubs in their nest behind-the-scenes through the Zoo's cub cam at http://virginiazoo.org/animals-plants/animals/mammals/animal-cams/.

"They're both pretty active and a bit on the spicy side, so Ginger and Cinnamon are perfect names for the cubs," said Greg Bockheim, the Zoo's executive director. "We hope the cubs will inspire people to learn more about these fascinating creatures and the challenges they face in the wild."

People suggested names for the cubs online and the top names were voted on by Zoo staff. Winners of a \$200 Zoo gift shop shopping spree will be randomly selected from the individuals who submitted the winning names.

Red pandas are small tree-dwelling animals native to the eastern Himalayas and southwestern China. Slightly larger than a domestic cat and with markings similar to a raccoon, red pandas have soft, dense reddish-brown and white fur that covers their entire body.
