FIELD TRIP GUIDELINES

ALL TEACHERS MUST READ AND SIGN THIS FORM.

- We acknowledge that the Zoo opens at 9:30 am and closes at 4:00 pm.
- We acknowledge that we need to arrive at least 15 minutes before our scheduled program.
- We acknowledge that school check-in will be held at the front of the Zoo entrance gate near the giraffe statue.
- We acknowledge that we will wait on the bus until a Virginia Zoo staff member tells us to disembark off the bus.
- We acknowledge that full payment is due before your group enters the Zoo.
- We acknowledge that the field trip discount is only available by making a reservation online. No exceptions.
- We acknowledge that we need to have a finalized head count of all individuals attending the field trip to the Program Reservations Specialist 24 hours before a scheduled field trip date.
- We acknowledge that we will enter through the entrance gates in an organized manner.
- We acknowledge that all students under the age of 16 are required to always have an adult with them. Students not accompanied by an adult will be escorted to the Zoo membership office and the Lead teacher will be notified for pick up.
- We acknowledge that due to the nature of the Zoo's programs, only the preapproved number of participants and chaperones will be able to enter the program. Pre-approved individuals will receive a wristband as their ticket into the program.
- We acknowledge that a lunch reservation is required to eat inside the Zoo, with a 10-day notice before the visit, based on availability. We will give the Zoo a 72-hour notice if we wish to cancel.
- We acknowledge that we are responsible for informing our chaperones of our field trip itinerary.
- We acknowledge that if our reservation must be rescheduled for any reason, the Program Reservations Specialist must be contacted at least 3 weeks prior to the originally scheduled reservation. Reschedule requests are subject to the availability of the new date requested.
- We acknowledge that the Zoo is open rain or shine and will dress accordingly.
- We understand the Zoo cannot page individuals or groups.

Nature Detectives (4th-12th Grade)

Follow the clues as we track down the animal predator in this zoo lab! Students will explore what it takes to be a wildlife biologist as they study animal tracks, scat replicas and more!

EATING AT THE ZOO

The Zoo has limited availability for schools to eat their lunch in an outside, designated area. Lunches will be set in 30-minute time slots at Flora Point. We do not have tables at this location, so it is more of a "picnic" spot. Please note, that this spot is outside and does not have a covered shelter. You must reserve a time slot to eat inside at the zoo. Groups with no lunch reservations will not be allowed to bring outside food inside. Do not use tables that are inside/outside the Zoo restaurants. We do not have a spot for your students to store their lunches. Students are welcome to carry their lunches with them while they explore or leave their lunches on the bus. We recommend that participants bring a backpack to carry their lunches, water bottles, and any additional resources they need for the day.

Boxed Lunches

The Virginia Zoo offers boxed lunches at a \$10 rate, making lunch time easy and convenient.

- Lunch requests can be added on to a field trip up to 10 days before your visit, based on availability.
- When you sign up for lunches, please include any known allergies, so that all accommodations can be made in the event of substitutions.
- Once confirmed and paid, you will be sent a lunch confirmation to show at our African Village Cafe restaurant, located in the Africa section of our zoo.
- Please give us a 72-hour notice if you wish to cancel. An invoice will be sent to your facility for any unpaid lunch orders.

Meal Vouchers

- Lunch requests can be added on to a field trip up to 10 days before your visit, based on availability.
- When you sign up for lunches, please include how many vouchers needed for your trip. Please state what time you plan to have your group eat lunch, so we can let the Restaurant staff know.
- Time slots are limited for Meal Vouchers. Groups will only have 30 minutes to eat lunch at the restaurant.
- Meal Vouchers are only exchangeable at the African Village Restaurant.
- A menu will be sent to your email once confirmed.
- Meal vouchers will be given out during check-in.
- Please give us a 72-hour notice if you wish to cancel. An invoice will be sent to your facility for any unpaid lunch orders.

WHEN YOU ARRIVE

Bus Information

Thank you for driving your group to the Virginia Zoo. For everyone's safety please follow the below instructions unless otherwise instructed by a Zoo staff member:



- The parking lot speed limit is 8 mph.
- Drive the outside perimeter of the parking lot as marked on the map to get to the Giraffe Statue. Do NOT cut through the parking lot.
- A bus loading zone is marked on the map. Do NOT unload, load, park or stand at any yellow curbing.
- Do NOT block any gates.
- Once unloaded please wait until there are no children beside your bus before pulling away from the curb.
- Watch for pedestrians.
- When sitting for more than 10 minutes, please turn off your engine.
- Bus parking is in the back of the parking lot. Please exit the parking lot and re-enter at the yellow cones to turn around.

Chaperones

Chaperones must pay through the school to receive the field trip discounted ticket price. If the school/group requires a separate invoice for the chaperones, please notify the Program Reservations Specialist. Additional chaperones/teachers that did not pay through the school must pay the listed General Admission price. Schools that booked an education program will receive wristbands for all the adults that paid through the school. Any adult without a wristband will not be able to enter the program space.

Please provide a list of all paid chaperones that will be attending your school/group field trip. The list can be emailed to the Program Reservations Specialist at vazoo.reservations@norfolk.gov

Chaperones that arrive before the school/group will be sorted into a zone to help crowd control at the Zoo's entrance gate. Please make sure chaperones are aware of your arrival time and the school's name. Information on your field trip will not be given out to individuals that are not on the chaperone list.

Please stand clear of the drop off area. We want to have the students disembark from the bus and line up in a timely manner. Once the students are done lining up a Zoo staff member will make a quick announcement. Students and teachers will enter in first and then the chaperones. Wristband and tickets will be checked for every chaperone entering the Zoo.

ZOO TRAIN

All Aboard the Virginia Zoo Express!

Climb aboard the Virginia Zoo Express at the Beazley Station in the Zoo's Plaza for a fun and informative journey around the Zoo!

Please be advised:

- Train tokens will not be sold. Instead, a 'train ride' will be sold upon boarding at the Beazley Train Station only.
- The Zoo Train will only operate during times that the temperature is above 55 degrees. The train will be closed during inclement weather and extreme temperatures. The Zoo Train may also be closed for maintenance.

The Train accepts cash, credit card, and business checks. Since the train may close during inclement weather, we request payments be made separately upon arrival to the Zoo on the day of your visit.

General Volunteer Information

What can you do as a volunteer?

Support the Virginia Zoo in its mission of engaging our community in taking action to save the world's wildlife and their ecosystems. Enhance the guest experience through education and interpretation, support daily operations and administration, help us put on exciting special events, or support our animals through care and conservation roles. Conservation Youth Team (CYT)

The Virginia Zoo's Conservation Youth Team (CYT) program is a volunteer and youth development program for ages 13 to 17 who are interested in learning more about wildlife and conservation, earning community service hours, and spending their time at the Zoo!

Overview of CYT:

- Guide Track CYT participants in this track hone their education and public speaking skills while providing enriching guest experiences, becoming familiar with Zoo stories and animals while encouraging and sharing their passion for conservation with Zoo guests!
- Camp Track CYT participants in this track will mentor campers and assist our Camp instructors with our Summer Safari Camp Programs. They'll learn how to lead games and manage groups while assisting in activities such as learning labs, zoo tours, behind-the-scenes experiences, and animal encounters!
- More opportunities become available to teens in good standing and continue in the CYT program for multiple years, including peer mentoring, community science, animal observations, and animal handling/husbandry!

FREQUENTLY ASKED QUESTIONS

Can parents who are members attend as chaperones for free?

Members only receive free admission for self-guided Field Trips. If schools are booking an education program, everyone participating in the program must be included in the count. If members would like to join onto a visit after an education program, they are welcome to still visit the Zoo, like normal using their membership.

Can children who are included in their family's membership visit for free?

Members only receive free admission for self-guided Field Trips. If schools are booking an education program, everyone participating in the program must be included in the count. Free member students do not count towards the number of free adult chaperones.

If I'm booking an animal program, do I get to pick the animals?

No. The Virginia Zoo cannot guarantee specific animal ambassadors. The ambassadors participating in the animal presentation will be chosen by staff at the Virginia Zoo. Ambassadors will be selected for your program based on animal health and safety.

Do I need to make a reservation for my ADA group?

We recommend all ADA groups to call or email the Program Reservations Specialist to make a reservation. ADA individuals will receive free admission with one free chaperone. Can schools pay by check? Yes. Checks should be made out to the Virginia Zoo.

Can I schedule a field trip on a weekend?

Our field trip experiences are only offered on weekdays. Your group can still come on the weekend, but they will have to purchase General Admission tickets

Can I change the number of students coming on a trip?

Yes, the number of students coming can be changed and the final payment due will be adjusted as needed. *Please note, lunch orders will need to be confirmed 10 days prior to your Zoo visit and cannot be adjusted after that.

Can I reschedule my trip?

Yes. Please contact the Program Reservations Specialist at vazoo.reservations@norfolk.gov or 757-447-2374 x229 to change dates.

What happens when a parent/chaperone is running late and needs to find a school group?

It is the responsibility of the school to let contacts and chaperones know where to meet if they arrive late. The Virginia Zoo will not be able to provide late arrivals with this information.

Are we allowed to bring our own lunch?

Yes. School & Group lunch spot locations are Flora point, which is next to our Garden Gazebo, and the Elephant Statue, which is outside the entrance gates. School & Groups are not allowed to utilize the tables inside or around the restaurants.

Can my students bring art to share with the Zookeepers?

Yes. We do accept small drawings/paintings to display in the ticket booths. Notes and artwork are shared with Zoo staff, but students won't be able to give it to the Zookeepers directly the day of your visit.

Will the train be running?

The Zoo train will only operate during times that the temperature is above 55 degrees. The train will be closed during inclement weather and extreme temperatures. The Zoo Train may also be closed for maintenance. Please call the day of your trip to see if the train is running for the day.

Will the fountain be on?

Fountains are turned on Memorial Day until Labor Day. Fountains will be turned off during inclement weather and weekdays during the school year.

Can I just show up and receive the field trip discount at the Ticket Booth?

Unfortunately, field trips must make a reservation online to receive the discounted tickets and perks. Groups that show up without a reservation will pay the listed General Admission cost.

Where do I go if I need a wheelchair?

Wheelchairs can be rented for the day on a first come, first-serve basis. They can be rented from the Zoo's Gift Shop or at the Stroller Shack, located just outside the shop. Regular wheelchairs: \$12

Is the Virginia Zoo Sensory Inclusive?

The Virginia Zoo has partnered with non-profit KultureCity to become a certified sensory-inclusive facility. A limited number of sensory backpacks and weighted lap pads are available in the membership office located inside the Zoo, to the left upon entering through the Ticket Booth. Bags are available for checkout at no cost to those visiting the Zoo.

What happens if there is inclement weather on the day of my trip?

The Virginia Zoo is a rain or shine attraction. Please provide 24-48 hours' notice if rescheduling. Rescheduling is subject to availability, and we may not always be able to accommodate your rescheduled date.

What if I can't reschedule my trip, can I get a refund?

The Virginia Zoo is open rain or shine. There are no refunds due to animal visibility or weather conditions. Special circumstances, including extremes in weather, construction, births, feeding and veterinary procedures may require that certain animals be removed from public viewing to ensure their best possible care. If you can't reschedule your trip, please contact the Program Reservations Specialist for assistance.

Is there a gift shop at the zoo?

Yes. The Virginia Zoo Gift Shop is open daily and located inside the Zoo to the left of the Membership office. Shop a wide variety of items for Zoo lovers of all ages, many of which support conservation efforts around the world. We do ask that only 1 group of 10 students with a chaperone enter at a time.
